Program Volume in Credits

The undergraduate educational program of Georgian Philology includes 240 ECTS credits, 60 ECTS credits per year, 30 ECTS credits per semester. Accordingly, the standard duration of the bachelor's program is 4 years. The academic year is based on the semester principle. One semester includes 19 academic weeks, therefore, the academic year is planned for 38 weeks. 1 ECTS credit is equal to 25 hours, which includes both the contact time of the student (lecture, seminar, practicum, etc.), as well as the time of his independent work (for midterm and final evaluation, as well as hours for homework preparation and presentation).

After the expiration of the undergraduate educational program of Georgian philology, a student with academic debt has the right to continue studying for additional semesters (not more than 4 semesters) in order to complete the educational program, while maintaining the status of a student.

The undergraduate educational program of Georgian Philology includes 240 ECTS credits, out of which:

- 135 ECTS credits are allocated to the mandatory courses of the specialty corresponding to the main field of study;
- 45 ECTS credits are allocated to the corresponding mandatory courses of the free component;
 - 60 ECTS credits are allocated to elective courses, which the student can choose from courses with optional status corresponding to the main field of study and the free component (the specific weight of the free component should not exceed 30 ECTS credits)

Ptre-requisites to the program

- A person with full general education has the right to study at the undergraduate educational program of Georgian philology.
- The prerequisite for admission to the undergraduate educational program is the unified national exams. The conduct of unified national exams is ensured by a legal entity under public law - the National Center for Examinations. An exception to the general rule of enrollment in the higher educational institution will be allowed only in accordance with the law.
- English as a foreign language is required for national exams.
- It is possible to enroll in the program on a mobility basis in accordance with the law.

Learning outcome 2.

Teaching and Learning Methods
