Afag Fazlollahi was born & raised in Karabakh region of Azerbaijan in the family of educators.

His teaching career has started in 1979, after receiving his first bachelor's degree, which was in Russian Literature and Russian Language, from the Institute of Slavic Languages, Baku, Azerbaijan. For years, he enjoyed teaching Russian language & literature in both Azerbaijani and Russian schools in Azerbaijan.

In 1994, he immigrated to the United States and continued his professional education. In 2001, he received his second degree, Bachelor of Arts in English (B.A.) from Georgia State University (GSU). In 2004, he completed his degree in Master of Art in English at the Georgia State University. Immediately after, he was accepted by the department of English to the PH.
