Program structure and credits	
<p>200 ECTS (120 US credits) are needed to achieve the results of the Joint Bachelor's Program in International Relations and Politics. Standard duration of the Program is 3 (three) academic years. The first two years (150 ECTS; 75 ECTS a year) are taught at Caucasus University and the last, 3rd year (50 ECTS/30 US credits) at NJCU.</p> <p>1 ECTS equals 25 study hours, which includes class hours and time spent on independent work (midterm and final examinations, as well as homework assignments).</p> <p>The program envisages courses from a narrow sphere of studies and the free component learning courses:</p>	

Learning courses of the main field (155 ECTS):

- Mandatory learning courses - 140 ECTS;
- Elective learning courses - 15 ECTS.

Learning courses of the free component (45 ECTS credits):

- University Mandatory learning courses - 15 ECTS;
- English language (mandatory) - 10 ECTS;
- Second foreign language (mandatory) - 20 ECTS.

Program Admission Requirements

- Any person who has completed a full secondary education is able to enroll in the program.
- The pre-condition for enrolment in the program is passing the Unified National Examinations. Examinations are conducted by LEPL the National Examinations Centre. Any exceptions to the Law on Enrolment at Higher Education Institutions are allowed only in the cases prescribed by the relevant law.
- Passing the English Language as a foreign language exam in the Unified National Examinations is a mandatory requirement for the program enrolment.
- Prospective students eligible to the program without having passed the Unified National Examinations must attest English language B2 level of proficiency (IELTS-6.0; TOEFL-78; or other relevant international certificate confirming B2 level proficiency) or he/she has to pass a University administered English language B2 level exam.
- Mobility to the program is allowed in accordance to procedures set by the relevant law.

Precondition for granting a degree

The precondition for granting a degree is completion of the program components within the prescribed deadlines.
