<b>Academic program in ECTS</b>	The undergraduate Joint Program in Psychology consists of 200 ECTS credits, with 75 ECTS credits taken in each of the first two years and 50 ECTS credits in the third year. The expected duration of the program is three years. Each academic year consists of two semesters. One semester totally 19 academic calendar weeks appropriately; each academic year covers 38 weeks. 1 ECTS credit sums 25 credit hours that, along with students' contact hours (classes, seminars, practical works), includes independent working hours (for midterm and final grading and credit hours for preparing homework and presentations).

Of the total, 140 ECTS credits are allocated to professional courses (125 ECTS credits for mandatory subjects and 15 ECTS credits for optional subjects), and 60 ECTS credits are allocated to the free component. These include 25 ECTS credits for mandatory general university courses, 20 ECTS credits for mandatory general English courses, and 5 ECTS credits for a mandatory Professional English language course. Additionally, 10 ECTS credits are allocated to optional second foreign language courses.

Note: If the foreign student presents the document of general English level proficiency, which is required by the program then s/he is free of studying general English and instead will study Georgian language within the framework of these credits. If the foreign student also knows Georgian Language then s/he can study other foreign languages or just use free credits, within the framework of these credits that are required by the academic program.

<b>The Program Goals</b>	<p>The program sets three principal goals that undergraduates are expected to achieve and demonstrate by the end of the program.</p> <p><b>The first goal</b> is to lay a foundation for a base of knowledge in core psychological concepts, theories, and methodologies, enabling students to conceptualize and apply psychological knowledge to personal development, interpersonal relationships, and broader sociocultural contexts. This foundation is built with an explicitly international academic orientation, ensuring that students are exposed to global perspectives and contemporary interdisciplinary scholarship in psychology.</p> <p><b>The second goal</b> is to provide students with more in-depth knowledge and an understanding of concepts, principles, current trends, and applications within different specialties through critical engagement with contemporary research and scientific evidence. The program fosters an interdisciplinary and cross-cultural perspective, preparing students for advanced studies or professional practice in diverse cultural environments. Opportunities such as international mobility, joint instruction, and exposure to U.S. academic standards further enrich the learning experience and broaden students' global competencies.</p> <p><b>The third goal</b> is to equip students with enhanced communication, collaboration, reasoning, and necessary research skills, enabling them to engage effectively in academic, professional, and cross-cultural contexts.</p>
