

Biography

Natia Songhulashvili completed her studies at the Georgian Technical University in the field of law from 1997 to 2002 and was awarded the qualification of a lawyer.

She is currently a PhD student at the School of Law of Caucasus University (since 2016). She has completed professional courses at the High School of Justice of Georgia, including: a certificate course for judicial assistants (2002-2003), the qualification exam for prosecutors (2004), and the qualification exam for judges (2007).

Natia Songhulashvili has many years of experience working in the prosecution and judicial system, as well as in the academic field.

Her professional career began in 2002 in the judicial system, where she worked as a judicial assistant at the Tbilisi Krtsanisi-Mtatsminda District Court from 2002 to 2005, was a judicial assistant at the Tbilisi City Court's Criminal Chamber from 2005 to 2006, and from 2006 to 2007, she was a judicial assistant at the Tbilisi Court of Appeals.

Since 2007, she continued her work in the prosecution system. From February to September 2007, she was an intern at the Tbilisi Didube-Chughureti District Prosecutor's Office, after which she became an intern in the Department of Procedural Leadership of Investigations at the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Georgia's General Prosecutor's Office, in the Special Service of Foreign Intelligence, and in the Ministries of Defense and Justice. From September to October 2007, she worked as a prosecutor at the Tbilisi Gldani-Nadzaladevi District Prosecutor's Office. From 2007 to 2009, she held the position of prosecutor in the Department of Procedural Leadership of Investigations at the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Georgia's General Prosecutor's Office, and from 2009 to 2013, she was the chief prosecutor of the same department. From 2013 to 2014, Natia Songhulashvili worked as a prosecutor in the Prosecutorial Supervision Department of the Investigative Division of the Chief Prosecutor's Office of Georgia, from 2014 to 2015 as the chief prosecutor of the same department, and from 2015 to 2018, she held the position of head of the same department. From 2018 to 2020, she was the prosecutor of the Autonomous Republic of Adjara. From March 2020 to March 2022, he held the position of Deputy Head of the Department for Supervision of Prosecutorial Activities and Strategic Development of the Prosecutor General's Office of Georgia. From 2022 to 2025, he was the Deputy Head of the Special Investigative Service.

Since July 2025, he has held the position of Deputy Head of the Department for Supervision and Strategic Development of the Prosecutor's Office of Georgia.

Additionally, from 2015 to 2018, he was a member of the independent collegial body — the Prosecutorial Council, established under the Ministry of Justice of Georgia, and in 2016 he

participated in the working group created for the development of the judicial system strategy for 2017-2021.

Alongside his professional activities, he is actively involved in the educational and academic field. From 2010 to 2011, he was a visiting lecturer at the Academy of Economics and Law in Tbilisi, from 2014 to 2015 — a visiting lecturer at the Academy of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Georgia, and from 2014 to 2022 — a trainer at the Training Center of the Prosecutor's Office of Georgia. He was a visiting lecturer at Caucasus University from 2017 to 2020, an assistant professor from 2020 to 2023, and since May 2023, he has held the academic position of associate professor. From 2022 to 2023, he also worked as a visiting educator at Black Sea International University.
