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I have always believed that, as a student of Diplomacy and International Relations, studying in an international environment is particularly important. I felt that such an experience would allow me to develop new skills and gain a deeper understanding of diplomacy in practice. Therefore, taking part in this international exchange represented the fulfilment of a long-held dream of mine.

Participating in the Erasmus+ exchange programme was one of the most significant and enriching experiences of my life, both academically and personally. I spent one semester in Hungary at Kodolányi János University, where I had the opportunity to continue my studies in a different academic environment, gain insight into a new culture and interact closely with students from a variety of countries. Working alongside students of different nationalities and with diverse backgrounds and experiences further demonstrated to me the importance of listening to and respecting different perspectives, as well as cooperating effectively in pursuit of a common goal.

The time spent in Hungary provided me with much more than just academic knowledge. Living independently in a foreign country for several months was an important personal challenge. I had to adapt to a new environment, manage everyday matters independently and adjust to a different cultural and social setting. This experience strengthened my confidence, sense of responsibility and independence. At the same time, it taught me the importance of stepping outside my comfort zone and taking advantage of new opportunities.

I want to say that Budapest is a city I will never forget. The view of the city from Fisherman's Bastion, the sight of the Danube from the steps of the Parliament at sunset are the things I will remember for the rest of my life. Just as importantly, I will remember the people I met during this experience, who helped broaden my horizons and contributed to my personal growth.
