Within the framework of the Erasmus+ Staff Mobility Program, representatives of the Quality Assurance Department of Caucasus University participated in a mobility visit to Ovidius University of Constanta, Romania.

During the visit, a series of introductory and working meetings were held with the university's academic and administrative staff. The representatives of Caucasus University had the opportunity to present the university, its recent achievements, international cooperation activities, and future development plans to local students and academic staff.

As part of the program, the participants met with the International Programs Coordinator, who provided detailed information about the admission and integration processes for international students, the administration of international programs, and the university's key internationalization initiatives. Meetings were also held with representatives and the Dean's Offices of the Faculty of Psychology and the Faculty of Letters, where discussions focused on the development of educational programs, academic cooperation, and the exchange of experiences and best practices.

In addition, the representatives of Caucasus University met with members of the university's research community, who introduced ongoing research projects, the main directions of scientific activity, and research management processes.

The visit also included a tour of one of the university's oldest libraries and the American Corner. Participants visited auditoriums and learning facilities, including medical training spaces, and were introduced to modern medical simulation models used in practical teaching and learning.

An important component of the mobility was the exchange of best practices related to both academic and administrative processes. The visit contributed to strengthening cooperation between the two institutions and provided valuable opportunities for sharing knowledge and experience in support of continuous quality enhancement in higher education.
