She is also a participant in the postdoctoral program “Social and Humanitarian Sciences in the Post-Crisis Period” at the European Scientific Institute (ESI). She holds a Master’s degree in European Union Law from the European Programme at the European Public Law Organization (EPLO). She is also a graduate of the 3rd edition of the World Notariat University of the International Union of Notaries.
