

Biography

Ekaterine Baghishvili is a Professor at Caucasus University and holds the academic degree of Doctor of Law. She teaches lecture courses in the General Part of the Law of Obligations, Contract Law, Family and Inheritance Law, Comparative Contract Law, and Private International Law at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Since 2003, she has been actively engaged in academic work at various higher education institutions. Over the course of her career, she has worked in both the private and public sectors.

She has been awarded a Max Planck grant (2013), as well as a DAAD scholarship (German Academic Exchange Service) in 2014 for conducting research at the Max Planck Institute for Comparative and International Private Law in Hamburg, Germany. She has also received a grant from the Ministry of Justice for the 2022 project “*Guide to Notarial Acts in Cases Involving a Foreign Element*” and a European Union grant under the program “*Mobility of Georgian Researchers in the Member States of the European Union*” for the 2023 project “*Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Court Judgments in the Context of Human Rights Protection.*”

Her scholarly interests focus on issues of private international law and the law of obligations, particularly in the context of the European unification of private law.

She is also a co-author of the *Commentary on the Civil Code of Georgia*.
