

### Biography

Irine Bokhashvili studied at the Faculty of Law of Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University from 1993 to 1999. At the same university, she completed her postgraduate studies with a specialization in criminal procedure (2000–2002) and, in 2004, successfully defended her doctoral dissertation on the topic “*Problems of Appellate Review in Criminal Cases*” under the supervision of Professor Apolon Paliashvili.

In 2011–2012, she participated in the Fulbright research program at George Washington University, USA. From 2007 to 2011, she headed the Mtskheta Bureau of the Legal Aid Service. Since 2000, she has accumulated extensive experience in academic and teaching activities at various universities in Georgia.

Since 2012, she has been affiliated with Caucasus University, where, since May 2024, she has held the position of Affiliated Professor at the School of Law. Since 2018, she has also been a member of the Dissertation Council of the Caucasus University School of Law. Since 2007, she has served as a member of various councils and editorial boards, including as a member of the Scientific-Advisory Council on Criminal Law of the Supreme Court of Georgia.

Since 2004, she has participated in numerous international and local research projects, conferences, training-of-trainers programs, and seminars. Since 2002, she has published around 20 scholarly works, including scholarly translations (co-authored).
