Marine Marinashvili is a Doctor of Law and an Associate Professor of Public Law at Caucasus University. Since 2002, she has been continuously engaged in academic work at various higher education institutions.

Her professional career has been closely linked to the process of higher education reform in Georgia. Since 2002, she has been actively involved in the introduction of the credit system and in the development of educational programmes. She has participated in Twinning projects, as well as in seminars and training sessions organized by the Council of Europe and the National Center for Educational Quality Enhancement of Georgia. She is also an accredited expert of the Council of Europe.

Over the years, she has taught courses in Constitutional Law and Fundamental Human Rights. She is the author of more than 25 scholarly publications in the field of constitutional law and the editor of three books. As part of her academic work, she has received both local and international research grants and has taken part in numerous local and international scientific conferences.

Alongside her academic career, she is also engaged in legal practice as a lawyer with a general specialization, which further enriches her academic work with practical legal experience.
